Wrap: One look at the week seven penultimate BCS rankings and the Bowl Championship Series makes itself overly clear as to who it believes deserves to play for the National Title. In placing more than .05 points between #3 Ohio State and #2 West Virginia, the BCS has spoken and believes Missouri and West Virginia most legitimate among the droves of teams ranked in the top ten this year. Both the Tigers and the Mountaineers have one more game to play, and a loss would spell the end of that National Title hope, of course, but as it sits now, the BCS yearns to face off the Big 12 North Champs and Big East Champs. If Missouri or West Virginia do lose, Ohio State, written off for dead two weeks ago, would reclaim a top two spot in the BCS after falling out for the two week span. Georgia would be next in line if both teams lose, with the possibility of a strong showing by Virginia Tech in the ACC Championship Game vaulting them over the top to the number two spot. By this time next week when you receive the eighth newsletter of the year, the BCS will have played itself out and we will know exactly who will play when and where in the grander scheme of things. Until that time though, we will be left to wonder what could transpire next Saturday.

Human Poll Wrap: In a season where weekly mirror images could be expected from the Coaches and the Harris, the second to last week delivers the greatest disparity of the season. In the Coaches' Poll this week, the West Virginia Mountaineers were declared the best team, while in the Harris, the Missouri Tigers were declared number one. Even the percentage spread was similar between the two number one teams and their trailers, a .009 % lag between the two in both. The unusual thing about the Harris this week, though, was that Hawaii received a first place vote in the Harris Poll and jumped to #10 this week in both polls after a convincing victory against Boise State. One would guess that a Missouri win in the Big 12 Championship Game would allow them to jump to number one in both polls, but do not count on anything in this crazy college football year.

Wrap: Pat White of the newly BCS powerful West Virginia Mountaineers makes an entrance into the Heisman picture in a year that may have been more highly regarded if not for the prohibitive favorite going into the last week of the season, Tim Tebow. With only Daniel and White among these four still to play another game, the two of them could theoretically take advantage of the lack of exposure in the most important week of the season. Tebow had a great week in his final game against the Florida State Seminoles, accounting for five more touchdowns to bring his total to 51. Tebow did break his hand mid way through the third quarter, but he had already put up big numbers, and his season is finished. McFadden, on the other hand played the whole game against LSU, and boy did he benefit from it. McFadden, who seemed to be slipping out of the race, got right back into the thick of things with an outstanding performance against previous BCS #1. By rushing for more than 200 yards, 3 TDs and throwing for a fourth, McFadden has almost assured himself of an invite to NYC for the Heisman dinner.

Next week's newsletter will arrive on Monday to account for the BCS Bowl selection process. You will also receive a newsletter when the Heisman candidates are announced with small summaries of their season and a prediction as to the winner.
